4. Discussion and Action items:

- 1. Update on City Projects

Mayor Winkel was in attendance and updated the committee on a number of current and potential projects. The Industrial Park could see its first tenant soon, there are two companies communicating about the property. Sioux City Brick has signed a 10 year lease for space in the old Long Lines Building for their corporate offices. There have been some talks about moving the cemetery for a couple of reasons. One reason the cemetery would be safety, not only for the drop off points but also sharing the road leading to the sight with the Sioux City Brick large trucks. Another reason would be the clay in that area could sustain Sioux City Brick for another 50 years. Sioux City Brick would pay for the moving of the cemetery as well as provide land for a new safer space. Mayor discussed the recent request from the City of Sioux City to increase sewer rates by 70%. Mayor has requested a 3% residential increase and a 10% commercial increase for a 1 year temporary basis until there is more time to investigate options. The splash pad was commented on stating there has been multiple delays but hopeful to have operational in about 10-14 days. The pool has had issues with a leak that could not be found. The leak was found today and is beginning the process of repair. There will need to be concrete removed to get to the multiple leaks but should be ready to open again in 2 weeks. Mayor commented that the Quiet Zone has finally been accepted and the train whistles have almost stopped completely. Mayor encourages residents to update City Hall of times when they hear the whistle, so it can be reported to the Railroad. Also noting the whistles to the airport side of town will still continue to blow, that is Sioux City and not a quiet zone. Mayor also commented on the accessorybuilding/garage on first street. The lawsuit has been settled and the height of the building will be brought down to 15 feet.

make them more aware of goings on. Members like the Newsletter, back page of the Advocate, Facebook and the City Website. Dianna Pelchat asked about the Convergys Building. Mayor noted FEMA is currently set up there working flooding issues across Iowa and Nebraska. Carol asked the committee how they feel about the ATV usage in town, no complaints where heard. Brad McCauley spoke on behalf of the School Board. The next school bond vote will be September 10th for \$33 million. This bond would be to build a new Primary building where the current Baseball and Softball fields are. The fields would be relocated to the acreage east of Lakeport along with concession stand, bathrooms and 2 tennis courts. Courts are being added due to SBL sharing with East currently yet only SBL students are on the varsity team. The plan calls for demolition of the Primary building; however, those costs will not be associated with the \$33 million dollar bond.
